ACTIVITY: COMPARE: Types of Identity Theft

- 2. Credit card fraud comprises the second largest group of identity thefts. Looking on page 14, what type of credit card fraud is the most common?

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- 3. Take a look at the graph on page 15. How would you describe the trends for each of the top 3 types of ID theft?
- 4. What type of ID theft occurs MOST often for people age 19 and under? How does this compare to the most common type of ID theft for the 20-29 and 30-39 age groups?
- 5. Identify one key takeaway you have from looking at the latest identity theft trends.
